We were coming home and even though we'd been on our bikes literally all day, Doug, Mike, Sharon and I were not ready to go home. We decided to go down to Little Five Points to buy some incense at a shop called Junk Man's Daughter. We purchased our incense and decided to walk up to the park at Little Five. There we met our first group of homeless. Some of the same ones that we see on a regular basis now.



They were hungry, we watched as some rummaged through trash cans in search of scraps of food thrown there, some walked with their heads down, searching for that lost coin to buy water.

During the next week, the Lord spoke to us all, convicting us to get out there and do something for these people. Not one of us had any experience in dealing with homeless and hungry people. But for the Grace of God, we'd never had to experience this type of life. We decided to go back to Little Five, stopping on the way to pick up 20 McDonald's hamburgers from the dollar menu.

The food was welcomed and so were we they loved our motorcycles and enjoyed the "biker preachers" as they call us. The people were very hungry physically and starving spiritually. They wanted to hear of Jesus Christ. We became farmers for the Father and sowed many seeds.

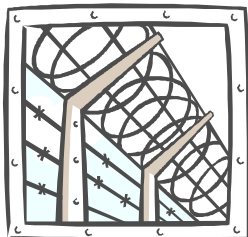
